THE WACO SAFETY PLEDGE IS A TWO WAY PLEDGE

Waco business owners are committed to keeping our community as safe as possible by implementing safety practices to limit the spread of COVID-19. We also respectfully ask our visitors to do their part by following recommendations and best practices for travelers.

This pledge is based on what we know now, and that may change. We will continue to stay informed of the latest information and adjust policies and procedures to keep our employees and patrons as safe as possible.

BUSINESS PLEDGE



All employees will be trained on appropriate cleaning and disinfection, hand hygiene, and respiratory etiquette.



We will follow all state, county, and local emergency orders.



All employees will wear face coverings.



We will meet or exceed all of the Minimum Standard Health protocols for our business outlined by the State of Texas.



We will implement physical distancing (at least six feet apart) amongst parties wherever possible.



All employees must pass a health screening before coming into work each day.



Hand sanitizing stations will be available to all customers and employees, including upon entry.



We will use disposable items when possible.



Employees will wash or sanitize their hands upon entering our business, and between interactions with customers



We will clean and disinfect common areas and surfaces regularly.

VISITOR PLEDGE



Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.



If soap and water are not available, bring and use hand sanitizer.



Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.



Keep six feet of physical distance from others.



Wear a face covering in public.



Cover coughs and sneezes.
